New book "The Runner McGough" by Tommy McGuire unveils story of how Monaghan man John McGough who was born to Irish emigrants to Glasgow in Scotland in 1880's became one of Scotland's most successful athletes of the early 1900's. He was a masseur with Celtic FC and was the first Irishman to become trainer with Manchester United in 1914. He would later become a masseur within GAA circles and trained the Monaghan team in their All Ireland clash with Galway in 1938 as well as later assisting Donaghmoyne, Ballybay Clontibret and Latton in claiming County titles. John Mc Gough became a hero in Cavan for his part in Cavan's two All-Ireland wins in 1947 in the Polo Grounds and their back to back win in 1948. John died in 1967 and lay buried for this past 50 years without even his name on the headstone. This book now reveals his incredible story and is of huge Irish interest. ## Wed 7 Feb: LIFE'S A BREEZE, 80M, 2013, Comedy

A cash-strapped Irish clan inadvertently discards a mattress that's stuffed with nearly a million euros, igniting a wild goose chase to find it again.

#### Wed 14 Feb: PHILADELPHIA HERE I COME, 95m Drama, 1975 CLASSIC NIGHT

Based on Brian Friel's hit 1964 play. Gar O'Donnell prepares to leave his Irish village of Balybeg, County Donegal and his seemingly insensitive father to live with his aunt in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. The hero has an alter ego, seen only by himself and the audience: the public Gar (Des Cave) holds back his true emotions, while the private Gar (Donal McCann) tells the brutal (and sometimes hilarious) truth. #### Wed 28 Feb: THE JOURNEY, 94M, Drama, 2016

During the 2006 Northern Ireland peace talks, Sinn Fein leader Martin McGuiness and Democratic Party leader Ian Paisley are forced to travel by car together. An excellent portrayal of two men who must look past themselves and their prejudices to build a peaceful future.

#### Wed 7 Mar: THE YOUNG OFFENDERS, 80m, 2016, Comedy

Inspired by true story of Ireland's biggest cocaine seizure in 2007, two hapless inner-city teenagers from Cork set out on bikes, cycling 160 kms to find a reported missing bale of cocaine. Received great reviews. Filmed in Cork City, the English Markets and the scenic West Cork coast.
